I. UNIVERSITY CENTERS: History & Purpose

➤ Board Of Regents established University Centers in 1996

Extend outreach & services to locations where there's no accredited campus/campus cannot offer full range of credentials needed in a community

Facilitate the commitment of the entire UH system to serve its constituencies on all islands



UNIVERSITY CENTERS

Three Current BOR Established University Centers:

- □University of Hawai'i Center Kauai (Admin by Kauai CC)
- □University of Hawai'i Center Maui (Admin by UHMC)
- □University of Hawai'i Center, West Hawai'i (Admin by HCC)



UNIVERSITY CENTERS

- >Serves as a gateway to the UH system
- >50+ degrees/credentials (Associates, Baccalaureate, and graduate degrees; certificates) in whole/part offered via distance delivery
- Degrees/credential offerings differ (community's higher ed priorities, center's ability to receive/support courses, services)
- Centers serve as "brokers" with UH campuses degrees/certificates awarded by University/community college that is offering the program of study, students remain on home island



II. FACILITATING STUDENT TRANSFERS

ROLES and PROCESSES

- > Hawai'i CC Counselor
- ➤ University Center, Educational Specialist (outreach, program advocacy, program promotion, networking/collaborations, workshops, student advocacy, pre-advising, other)
- >UH Mānoa Academic Advisor



III. WRAP-AROUND SERVICES

ROLES and PROCESSES

- ➤ Hawai'i CC Counselor (meets with prospective/current students at the community college)
- ➤ University Center, Educational Specialist (math workshops, advocacy, local support, "Distance Ed" new student orientation, promote on-site University's Advising visits)
- ► UH Mānoa Academic Advisor (works with both the counselors and educational specialists in receiving students into the Manoa programs)



IV. POSITIVE OUTCOMES

► Individual *SUCCESS*:

- □Graduation from & participation in local graduation ceremonies (14 Graduate and 67 Bachelor degrees; 81 certificates since 2011)
- □Impact on family: economics, social welfare, generational impact, role modeling
- **Community** *SUCCESS*: Students work, live in and contribute to their community, i.e., teachers, social services, businesses, etc.)
- **▶UH System** *SUCCESS*: Increased awareness and utilization of University of Hawai'i programs



V. WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

- Consistent course availability
- ➤ Increased access to program/academic advisors
- Clear advising sheets with concise course requirements

(ie: see HawCC and UHWO website: advising sheets)

- Expansion of program offerings/methods (online, online synchronous, hybrid, etc.)
- Streamlined, uniform approach to advise & guide students through entire process
 - >(recruitment→advising→support)
